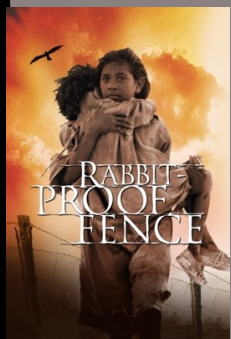

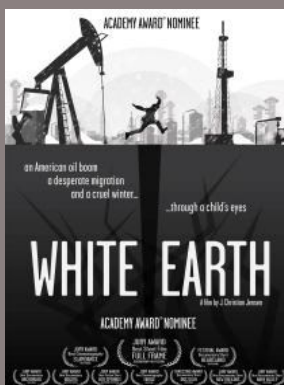

The Green Buffalo

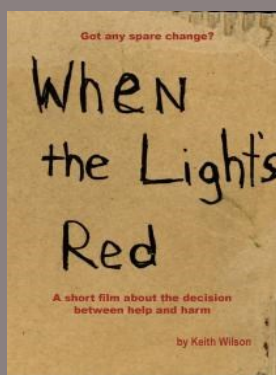
